Attendance and Punctuality

Our whole school attendance to date is at 93%. We aim to be above the standard which is 95%, but we understand this time of year can bring lots of tummy bugs and colds. As always, if your child has sickness/diarrhoea please



keep them at home for 48 hours and call to let us know. Punctuality is very important for your child's education as we like to start their learning as soon as the doors close. If you are struggling to get to school, we still have our Panda Club (Breakfast Club) which starts at 8am until 8.30am. Please call the office to book or use or online payment system SCO Pay. Please note, Panda Club is not available for Tiny Teds', due to staff ratios needed.
