




Thursday 7th and Friday 8th September


Nursery children will attend school for half a session. 8.45am – 11.45am

What do we in Nursery

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) covers the first stage of a child's care from birth to five years old. It sets the standards to ensure that all children learn and develop, as well as keeping them healthy and safe. It is the bases that we build our curriculum on in nursery and reception.

There are seven Areas of Learning included in the EYFS:

- Communication and Language
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

Young children learn and develop through play and exploration. The adults support this through guidance and teaching of skills.




















Here at St. Michael's we follow the acclaimed Read, Write Inc. programme.

During the morning your child will begin their journey through the various stages of phonological awareness with the help of this award winning system.


To aid your child in their learning we recommend that you enjoy reading aloud with them as much as possible, this will help them to amass a varied and colourful vocabulary.













Learning can be Messy!


Exploring in the water tray is giving me lots of maths and scientific skills! I love pouring, filling and emptying! I usually wear an apron but sometimes my clothes get wet!







I sometimes get pen and paint on my clothes! This is because I am developing creative skills and ^{exploring} lots of different ways of making amazing art!



Sometimes I might get dirt on my clothes.



Using a knife and fork at lunchtime is tricky! Sometimes I get food on my clothes!

Exploring with playdough and other messy play resources like foam or food helps me to develop fine motor control and build up muscles and coordination in my hands and fingers. I will need these when I learn to write.

Our mud kitchen is so much fun! I use all my senses, which is so important for my development. It also helps me use my imagination and practise playing with my friends nicely!



Clothing

Uniform can be ordered online.

- Please label all clothing with your child's name.
- Please do not send children to school wearing jewellery. Children will not be able to do P.E. if they have earrings in.
- Please ensure clothing is manageable for children to remove and dress themselves-this is especially important when they are learning to use the toilet independently. We advise jogging bottoms, leggings or a skirt.
- Nursery DO NOT require a PE kit, however, they will be removing socks, shoes and jumpers for the session, so easy fastening shoes (such as Velcro), are advised.
- Please bring clothing appropriate for the weather as we operate **an outdoor curriculum everyday**. Please feel free to leaves waterproofs/wellies on your child's peg.
- If your child requires spare nappies, wipes, pants etc. they will need to be provided and can also be left at school. We will always let you know if we need replacements.






Attendance and Punctuality

- Attendance in Nursery is not compulsory, however, we do monitor attendance and will alert you regarding any concerns e.g. not arriving to school when expected.
- Any absences should be reported promptly to the school office.
- We will also speak to you about persistent lateness.
- We encourage parents not to book holidays during term time as this can have a detrimental effect upon your child's development.





Dinners

Useful Information

Nursery children have the option of staying with us for lunch. All meals are freshly cooked in our on site kitchen. Menus are displayed each week on notice boards and on our website. Please inform us promptly of any specific dietary requirements.

Please note - as an alternative to a hot school lunch, your child may have a sandwich or jacket potato with various fillings. Please inform the office on Monday morning if you would like to change any of the menu choices for that week.

If you are not eligible for 30 hours, your child can stay until 1.30pm at a cost of £5.50 (which includes dinner). If you would like them to stay until 3pm, they can do so at a cost of £9 (which also includes dinner and an afternoon snack).


Snack money
