### **Actions in response to the survey:**

- School will continue to fund/provide pupils with a home-login for Purple Mash so that children have a safe platform to use at home, to play games/study on.
- School will share research with parents about safe internet usage times for infant aged children.
- School will diarise an alert for the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month to remind parents to check their child's privacy settings at home. The alert will be shared via Class Dojo.
- Home internet usage rules will be shared to support parents in discussing safe practice with their children.
- PEGI ratings will be shared again for any platforms being used by families which are inappropriate for the childrens' age ranges.
- School will further research 'who' children are playing with online to gain clarity over the responses given in this survey.
- Information will be shared with parents about appropriate bodies who provide online safety support/regulation.
- Information will be shared about how to block/report inappropriate online activity at home.
- School will continue to provide a monthly online safety newsletter for parents – this will continue to be shared via Class Dojo and on the school website.
- School will arrange for another annual meeting for parents to be delivered by the online safety team at Cumbria Police – this was successful last academic year.
